



Government initiatives like the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (Education for All) aims to provide universal elementary education, ensuring basic schooling infrastructure in rural and urban areas.

Key aspects

Vast reach

India has ~14.7 lakh government schools, serving 24.8 crore students, especially in rural and under-served areas where private schools are often scarce or unaffordable. This extensive reach ensures that even the remotest regions have access to primary and secondary education.

Access to affordable education

India's government schools offer free or subsidised education, making it affordable for families with limited resources. This affordability is crucial in a country where many families live below the poverty line. Additionally, schemes such as free midday meals, textbooks, uniforms, and scholarships help reduce the financial burden on families and enhance school attendance.

Focus on inclusivity

The Right to Education (RTE) Act mandates free and compulsory education for children aged 6 to 14 years, ensuring that government schools remain accessible and inclusive. The government school network promotes inclusive education and accommodates children from all social, economic, and caste backgrounds. Various programmes support marginalised communities, including Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and children with disabilities.

Teacher workforce

India's government school system employs over 9 million teachers, making it one of the largest teaching workforces in the world. While challenges remain related to teacher-student ratios and the quality of education, the sheer scale

of this workforce reflects a significant commitment to providing education.

Digital and infrastructure initiatives

The government has made substantial efforts to improve school infrastructure, including classrooms, sanitation, electricity, and internet connectivity particularly in rural areas. Programmes such as Digital India and the PM eVIDYA scheme have introduced free digital learning resources, helping bridge learning gaps and adapt to evolving educational needs.



of school facilities and digitisation to enhance the student experience.


Education scholarship scheme



Founder's message





"UNSTOPPABILITY **BEGINS WITH A** VISION: TO BE THE CHANGE ONE **WISHES TO SEE IN** THE WORLD."

Amitabh Shah, Founder and Chief Inspiration Officer of Yuva Unstoppable, explains why he left a well-paying corporate career to start YUVA

Why did you leave a career in the USA to start Yuva Unstoppable in India?

The story began on an 18-hour flight from New York to Ahmedabad in 2004. I was returning from Yale University's MBA programme. I watched the film Swades on the flight home. It triggered memories of Kamalaben — my former nanny — who I had not seen in years. Where would she be now? Would she even remember me? Would she be happy to know where I had reached? Was she well looked after in her old age? Had we been fair to her across the years? Had our family forgotten her? Had her engagement just been a transaction?

I did the unusual: I said 'Chalo, gothiye ehne', implying the need to locate her. That one decision – out of the way and out of the blue – was to reshape my life. I did locate her: when I walked tentatively up to her under a tree, she was an 82-year-old weighing just 28 kilograms. She had been abandoned; she had no place to go.

That one incident shifted my perspective.

While I did go back to complete my MBA at Yale, I declined a Wall Street job offer and returned to

India. The family was apprehensive ('Tu ainyya karshe shu?') but eventually reconciled. That is the story of how Yuva Unstoppable was founded – a youth volunteer network committed to the marginalised in slums and orphanages.

Why did you call the organisation Yuva Unstoppable?

The youth are the drivers of our society; the success of our country is determined by how well we provide for our youth.

This is even more important since almost half of India's population is under 35 years of age. This population segment needs to be provided resources and opportunities to grow into empowered citisens. This is what Yuva focuses on: widen opportunities for marginalised youth. We believe that this is possibly the most effective catalytic initiative in India today: the capacity to transform our marginalised youth into achievers. It is an endeavour with sweeping transformative outcomes across generations. The Return on Capital Employed of such an initiative is infinite; each improvement generates spin-off improvements with no end to upsides.

If you ask me 'What is the single biggest initiative that will drive India to greatness?', my answer will be: Educate every single youth. This one initiative can transform 1.45 billion destinies. This is the space that Yuva Unstoppable is engaged in.

What makes Yuva Unstoppable different?

When one addresses the needs of a youth base that is possibly the largest in the world, what one needs to do is respond with an enabling framework.

A framework that will facilitate a quick ramp-up; a framework that will aggregate diverse competencies; a framework that is open to timely course-correction; a framework that is flexible and responsive.

I cannot over-emphasise this point: if one were to addresses this challenge in a conventional manner, there is a possibility one may never see a positive outcome in our lifetime – at least on the necessary scale. The very nature of the challenge warrants an innovative response. This explains why Yuva Unstoppable is a volunteer eco-system, where individuals from all – I cannot over-emphasise the importance of this word - walks of life can aggregate and contribute.

Our volunteers drive community-based programmes. Our volunteers appraise the absence of basic facilities (clean toilets for instance) while teaching in government schools. Our volunteers indicated that a core educational focus would need to extend to cover healthcare, sanitation and infrastructure gaps for the marginalised. Our volunteers graduated us from basic education to holistic community engagement around a core educational agenda.

Now come from the intangible to the tangible. We do not construct and commission new schools; we transform the existing infrastructure; more specifically, we seek to transform government schools that are not only the largest in number but also where the upside available to make a positive change is the largest. Besides, the credibility of having worked with government schools serves as a reference to cover more such schools, creating an attractive growth runway.

How has Yuva Unstoppable widened impact?

We enhance the quality of available **infrastructure.** For instance, we upgrade classrooms, integrate digital tools, and provide scholarships. We prioritise holistic student well-being; we partnered Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence to provide emotional and academic support. We transform government schools by improving sanitation, clean water access, digital literacy, scholarships, health care and nutrition. We provide resources to enhance student success. The result is that when we select to work with a school, we take a consolidated view of all that is needed to transform it into a credible institution.

This relatively asset-light approach (considering that we do not build any infrastructure from scratch) has enhanced value-addition; this has made it possible for us to spend where returns are highest and quickest; we invest in pockets not being addressed by the

others. By being liberated from spending precious financial resources in brick and mortar across an inordinately long period with attending construction delays, we have been able to graduate towards timely holistic and relatively immediate educational outcomes

The result is that we are now being perceived as the precious educational octane that will deliver a higher productivity of the core fuel (infrastructure). Our role has also helped highlight the fact that for every investor in 'hard' assets, there is a need for a specialised partner in 'soft' assets who can liberate the full value of the former.

What has been the outcome of this lateral approach?

We have progressively expanded our reach. We now touch seven million beneficiaries across more than 6,000 schools in 25 Indian States and 7 Union Territories. That is larger than the population of, say, a country like New Zealand. That is more than 75 per cent of the population of a country like Israel.

This growth has been catalysed by the value aggregated through our partnership eco-system. This comprises over 100 organisations like Gates Foundation, Google, Bank of America, Disney, Mercedes Benz, HDFC, Lenovo and UNICEF among others; these companies have invested in infrastructure, sanitation, and digital improvements. We launched large programmes to improve rural water

availability, electricity access (solar) and build sporting infrastructure.

The result is that Yuva-supported schools have acquired a recall and pedigree; Yuva engagements have translated into positive outcomes. We are now being seen more than just an NGO putting together education programmes; we are being seen as a social catalyst. We are being seen as an educational transformation agency creating a large social ripple. There is a wider expectation that if we have selected to work with a government school, attendances, student health, academic engagement and holistic development will improve.

We are being recalled with the lines that 'Agar Yuva juda hai, to samaajik sudhar hoga!'

What were the highlights of what the organisation achieved in 2024?

The year 2024 was marked by resilience and growth. We focused on recovery, rebuilding and ensuring a sustainable future for students and communities.

We partnered Lenovo and HDFC Bank to distribute more than 10,000 tablets to students and marginalised children.

We rolled out a 'green' component in our school transformation programme. We introduced rainwater harvesting, solar panel installations, and tree planting. These initiatives were aimed at raising the groundwater table, enhancing access to usable water and providing backup power in schools.

Our partners contributed to the commissioning of sports grounds in schools, ideal for physical activity, assembly, and extra-curricular activity.

Our scholarship programme increased coverage from 40 to more than 5,000+ students across 25 States, providing financial assistance, mentorship, and corporate internships.

What are the goals of Yuva Unstoppable?

In five years, we intend to double our schools coverage to 15,000. This would make us among the largest NGOs focused on value-added educational support. We will also seek to deepen our orientation from the basic to the inspirational. This will empower thousands to dream and become visionaries that take the world ahead.

This rapid growth can only be achieved if young professionals play a more direct role in this educational movement. I urge start-up professionals to donate a small percentage of their wealth to philanthropy. When we started, we had no perspective of how this would shape. In the space of just 19 years, \$100 million in pledges have been dedicated to specific projects. This nature of engagement - young funding to support the young – could catalyse social change, create a more empathetic nation, provide the marginalised a wider opportunity and enhance national prosperity.

The bottomline is that in a number of parts of the country, the transformed standard of government schools has emerged as a benchmark, a far cry from a time they were considered a laggard.

#1 EXIDE INDUSTRIES LIMITED



Transforming education across six states

In partnership with Yuva Unstoppable, Exide industries revitalised 130 schools and two colleges, benefitting over 63,000 individuals. This initiative included the creation of smart classrooms, STEM labs, WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) facilities, and libraries.

#2 BANK OF AMERICA



Revolutionizing the education of 1,25,000 beneficiaries

Bank of America partnered with Yuva Unstoppable to transform 392 schools, setting up 313 smart classrooms and providing 480 resource centers with devices like tablets and disability-support equipment. The electronic tablet initiative reached 14,918 students, while 25,000 ration kits and 1.24 million COVID-19 vaccines supported local communities. These efforts impacted the lives of over 1,25,000 students.

The initiative included the installation of 913 smart classrooms and 2,978 solar street lights, with the entire project completed in just six months.

Its commitment to improving educational access and infrastructure created safe and supportive learning environments. These transformative efforts led to

increased enrollment and attendance improved personal hygiene, and enhanced student morale cum engagement. By upgrading school facilities, Fortis empowered students and created opportunities for brighter futures.

Overview

Since 2018, the H.T. Parekh Foundation, a philanthropic organisation committed to support education, healthcare and community development, Yuva Unstoppable to transform 155 schools, improving the lives of over 44,000 students. This collaboration showcases the foundation's dedication to address critical gaps in school infrastructure, fostering a healthy and conducive learning

environment for the under-served. The foundation achieved significant outcomes, such as increased enrolment and attendance, creation of safe hygiene spaces and enhanced student morale.

Initiatives

- Enhanced 155 schools with upgraded infrastructure, including WASH (water, sanitation, and hygiene) facilities, sports grounds and newly constructed classrooms.
- Improved 17 schools by providing tailored solutions, such as WASH facilities, drinking and dishwashing areas, smart classrooms and library

Overview

Overview

At Yuva Unstoppable, we believe that there is only one consistently dependable factor that lifts families out of poverty: Education.

Power of education

Education provides unprecedented lifetransforming opportunities. Education makes it possible to climb economic classes. Education leads to improved life quality. Education is a social equaliser.

In view of this, we are committed to extend educational opportunities to children and young adults from underprivileged backgrounds.

In line with this goal, we introduced Project Udaan in 2015 - a dedicated scholarship programme for meritorious students from underprivileged families across India.

This programme covers educational expenses, including school fees, tuition expense, books and stationery. This support makes it possible for families to keep their children in school without interruption.

Yuva Unstoppable's involvement extended beyond expense coverage to soft skills training, mentorship, career counselling and corporate sessions. Yuva Unstoppable graduated from a donor to a partner.

Inception

The introduction of the Right to Education Act made education accessible for all Indian children. This benefited those hailing from under-privileged backgrounds the most.

What was once a privilege now became a delivered fundamental right.

However, this provision applied only till a child reached 14 years of age, following which children from underprivileged families dropped out of school either because their parents could not afford further education or because their parents now wanted them to earn a living. To ensure that these children

completed their education and realised their potential, there was a need to make higher education more accessible.

Udaan was conceived to address this need.

Transparency

To fulfill this objective, Yuva Unstoppable set in place a rigorous system to ensure that only the most deserving candidates benefited.

Yuva Unstoppable launched a web portal for scholarship applications, document upload, and online approvals, automating the shortlisting process and ensuring that the selection was independent of biases of caste, creed, colour and region. Virtual interviews were conducted with the child and parent, deepening the due diligence.

Success

Yuva Unstoppable launched Udaan not to play the role of a benefactor but to emerge as a friend, philosopher and quide.

This was visibly demonstrated during the pandemic, when institutions switched to online classes. When hundreds of students across government schools did not possess a smartphone or tablet, without which their education would have been interrupted, Yuva Unstoppable collaborated with Lenovo to distribute more than 10.000 electronic tablets to marginalised students. Besides, Yuva Unstoppable distributed rations to student homes, supporting their families during a challenging phase. It counselled parents to remain invested in their children's education.

Yuva Unstoppable collaborated with coaching institutes - local and prominent - to prepare students for competitive examinations at free or discounted rates. This personalised approach and other student-centric initiatives helped grow our student network from 40 in 2015 to 5,000+ in 2024. More than 550 are now studying in renowned government

and semi-government institutions; 51 were accepted at the prestigious Indian Institute of Technology.

Robust governance

The organisation maintains strong oversight through regular Board meetings, detailed MIS reporting, and a centralised IT platform that offers real-time updates on project progress. Dedicated to driving social impact, Yuva Unstoppable engages donors, conducts thorough impact assessments, and adopts innovative strategies to create meaningful community values. Transparency is a cornerstone of Yuva Unstoppable's operations, ensured through regular audits by reputable firms, strict adherence to compliance standards, and a comprehensive financial disclosure policy. By digitizing its processes,

Yuva Unstoppable has streamlined operations and improved monitoring, leveraging expertise from partners such as CSRbox and the London School of Economics. A disciplined approach to risk management, ethical practices, and strategic expansion enables sustainable growth and lasting impact. Yuva Unstoppable's unwavering commitment to financial integrity and accountability reinforces its reputation as a trusted leader in the non-profit sector, dedicated to transforming lives.

Initiatives

 Yuva Unstoppable facilitated the installation of 5-10 KW capacity solar panels in selected schools to provide a sustainable energy source.

- Solar panel systems were connected directly to essential building equipment, such as lights and fans, ensuring power availability even during grid outages.
- Yuva Unstoppable's solar street lights project was aimed to benefit underserved communities by installing solarpowered street lights. This initiative improved safety, extended productive hours and reduced carbon footprint in rural and urban areas.

A Teacher's Vision at GMI School, Pune



Then came a transformative change: the installation of solar panels and a rainwater collection system. For Vaishali, this was more than just a solution—it symbolised a new beginning. The school's water supply became reliable, keeping toilets clean and functioning, and students were healthier and happier. The garden flourished, replacing withered plants with vibrant greenery, and the school gained a sustainable, cost-effective energy source through the solar panels.

This shift also had a profound impact on classrooms. With constant power, students could now use computers and other educational tools without disruption. Technology became an integral part of the learning process, and the school's environment improved in ways Vaishali had once only dreamed of.

What began as a vision for a better learning space turned into a thriving, sustainable community where students and teacher could grow together.



Yuva Unstoppable facilitates early childhood development, preparing young children for formal education

Overview

The Yuva Unstoppable Anganwadi programme has made strides in transforming early childhood education and care in under-served communities across India. Focusing on the holistic development of children, the initiative has improved the infrastructure, education, and health services of anganwadi centers (AWCs). Yuva Unstoppable has renovated numerous AWCs, creating safe and child-friendly environments equipped with modern amenities. These upgrades include improved sanitation facilities, vibrant classrooms, and secure play areas, all of which contribute to fostering a nurturing and conducive learning atmosphere for young children.

Key impacts

Child health improvement: Through the AWCs, essential healthcare services such as immunisations, growth monitoring, and early health issue detection are provided. This proactive approach leads to enhanced child health and well-being, ensuring early interventions for any developmental concerns.

Enhanced maternal health: The programme plays a crucial role in promoting better maternal health by advocating for healthier birth spacing, which reduces risks associated with closely spaced pregnancies. AWCs offer nutritional guidance during pregnancy, improving maternal health outcomes. The programme also addresses maternal anemia through targeted interventions, ensuring that mothers receive the necessary nutritional support.

Early childhood development:

The programme fosters cognitive development and prepares children for school by providing access to early learning initiatives, digital learning tools, and educational toys. These resources help nurture children's intellectual growth and readiness for formal education.

Infrastructure improvements:

YUVA Unstoppable is committed to upgrading AWC facilities, creating safe and conducive environments for children, mothers, and Anganwadi workers. The programme emphasises the importance of clean drinking water, provides essential ration kits sourced from local vendors, and ensures that Anganwadi workers receive proper training. These infrastructure and resource improvements enhance the overall efficiency and effectiveness of the services delivered.

Overview

In January 2025, Zerodha Broking Services Limited and Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF) partnered Yuva Unstoppable to develop sustainable learning spaces and improve nutrition, health, and educational outcomes for children attending Anganwadi Centers (AWCs) in Kashi district, Uttar Pradesh.

Zerodha will lead the project's implementation by transforming AWCs into environmentally sustainable spaces. This will include providing necessary amenities such as clean drinking water, well-ventilated area, and solar panels or access to electricity.

BMGF will focus on ensuring the provision of high-quality Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) and Maternal, Infant, and Young Child Nutrition (MIYCN) services, specifically targeting the health of pregnant women, lactating mothers, and children aged 0-6 years.

The project will address various components of the public health ecosystem affecting MIYCN, including Anganwadi Centers, the supply chain of fortified foods, healthcare institutions (CHCs, PHCs), training for Frontline Workers (FLWs), community awareness, and overall institutional strengthening.

Objectives

- Create an enabling environment that fosters the growth and development of children aged 3-6 years by establishing environmentally sustainable learning spaces and promoting a sense of responsibility toward protecting nature.
- Improve the health and nutritional status of adolescent girls, pregnant women, lactating mothers, and children aged 0-6 years through quality healthcare, nutrition, and Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE).

- Transform 65 anganwadis into multiintervention hubs, by developing green learning materials and providing appropriate teacher learning materials.
- Train anganwadi workers in early childhood education, providing handson support, fostering community awareness and parent engagement.

- Undertook capacity building sessions for AWC workers to deliver high-quality early childhood education and care.
- Organised community engagement activities such as parent teacher meetings (PTMs), godbharai (traditional baby showers), and annaprashan (first feeding ceremonies) to foster community relationships.

Overview

Proper nutrition during pregnancy and lactation is crucial for the health of mothers and babies. YUVA Unstoppable's Suposhit Maa Abhiyan provides essential nutrients to support immunity, prevent malnutrition, and ensure healthy development. This initiative improves health outcomes, reduces infection risks, and promotes healthier births, paving the way for stronger future generations.

Benefits of pre-natal nutrition

Support fetal growth: Provide essential nutrients for organ formation and development.

Reduce birth defects: Lower the risk of congenital disabilities with folic acid and iodine.

Boost brain development: Aid cognitive growth with Omega-3, iron, and choline.

Prevent maternal complications:

Lower the risk of anemia, gestational diabetes, and preeclampsia.

Enhance maternal health: Strengthen immunity, energy levels, and overall well-being.

Ensure healthy birth weights: Reduce low birth weight risks for better longterm health.

Lay a strong foundation: Support lifelong physical and cognitive development.

LSE IMPACT ANALYSIS: SCHOOL TRANSFORMATION PROJECT

Overview


Yuva Unstoppable's school transformation initiatives, including digital classroom programs and WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) infrastructure improvements, were subjected to a comprehensive impact analysis by London School of Economics (LSE). The study evaluated the effectiveness of interventions in enhancing educational outcomes in under-served government schools.


The LSE impact analysis highlighted the success of Yuva Unstoppable's


interventions and provided a framework for ongoing scaling and improvements. The data-driven insights will inform Yuva Unstoppable's work, enabling the organisation to strengthen programmes and transform education for underserved communities.


Methodology


- The LSE analysis utilised a robust evaluation framework, focusing on the outcomes of Yuva Unstoppable's interventions in 156 schools across four Indian states (Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, and Maharashtra).
- The study divided schools into groups: a control group and an intervention group. The control group (49 schools) served as a baseline, while the intervention group (107 schools) had received either the Smart Classroom
- (SC) or the combined WASH and SC interventions.
- The analysis involved quantitative and qualitative data, including pre and post-surveys, student attendance, enrolment records, and test scores. The data from the intervention schools were compared with the baseline data from the control schools to measure impact on student outcomes (enrolment, attendance,
- academic performance, and teacher engagement).
- The study assessed the effectiveness of the digital classroom initiatives, including the K-Yan (Knowledge Vehicle) technology, which transforms traditional classrooms into interactive learning environments. The analysis measured the outcomes of the WASH interventions on student health, absenteeism, and overall school hygiene.

















The LSE study's findings

Student outcomes

- 4x improvement in learning outcomes in maths, science and other subjects
- 15% improvement in overall attendance
- 14% increase in attendance in schools with WASH interventions
- 16% increase in attendance in schools with WASH and smart classroom interventions

Teacher outcomes

- Process of training, adaptation and engagement with Yuva and equipment provides additional skills for teachers
- Use a theoretical framework proposed by Coe et al (2014) to examine teacher outcomes
- Using qualitative feedback from the operational team at Yuva Unstoppable, we operationalise the framework to offer insights into how the smart classroom impacts teaching

Outcomes on inclusion

- Yuva Unstoppable's projects focused on low-income, urban schools, often serving children from the families of labourers, farmers, and essential service workers (SDG 4 of quality education)
- Digital classrooms and improved sanitation enhanced holistic education
- Multimedia content made learning more interactive and effective

Benefits to Yuva

The LSE impact analysis proved invaluable to Yuva Unstoppable:

One, it provided empirical evidence to validate the effectiveness of its programs. By demonstrating the correlation between Yuva Unstoppable's school

transformation efforts and improved educational outcomes, the analysis helped build credibility and trust with donors, partners, and other stakeholders.

Two, the findings offered Yuva understanding of how interventions (WASH and Smart Classrooms) improved student attendance, enrolment and academic performance.

Three, the state-wise results allowed Yuva to refine its approach and interventions to the specific needs of regions.

BANK OF AMERICA'S IMPACT ANALYSIS OF THE TAB-BASED LEARNING AT YUVA UNSTOPPABLE



Overview

The pandemic catalysed online learning, impacting students in government schools who lacked access to smart devices, affecting attendance.

To address this challenge, Yuva Unstoppable tied-up with Lenovo and HDFC to distribute free tablets to the students. This tab-based blended learning initiative aimed to bridge this digital divide, allowing equitable access to education and fostering an interactive, multimedia learning environment.

Bank of America (BoA) undertook an impact analysis across 4,018 students in Gujarat and Maharashtra. The BoA impact analysis not only highlighted the success of Yuva Unstoppable's interventions but also provided a framework for ongoing improvement.

Methodology

- Monitoring student attendance, assignment completion, and engagement levels.
- Collection of data related to monthly attendance, assignment submissions and engagements before and after Yuva Unstoppable.
- Conducted comparative analysis between tablet-enabled and nontablet-enabled classrooms.
