## NOTE FROM FOUNDER



Dear Friends,

As I reflect on this past year's journey, I cannot help but be reminded of the strength and resilience that I have seen and experienced first-hand from our students, our communities and our well-wishers. I would like to reflect on this positive sentiment as we rise to the occasion and move forward from the unprecedented crisis of the pandemic to march forward into a future full of hope and creativity. The year has been about recovery, assessment through the testing times and rebuilding for the future. And Yuva Unstoppable has remained true to its mission, expanding to 4000 schools spread across 18 states of India, reaching over 6 million individuals.

As our students struggled with the break in education, Yuva Unstoppable diverted its focus on ensuring that children were provided access to tools essential for them to stay connected to their studies and take classrooms into their homes. The 'Tab-Based Learning' programme at Yuva Unstoppable ensures learning never stops through shared digital access for children. Through this initiative, Yuva partnered with the Yale Centre of Emotional Intelligence, focussing on students' mental health as they

overcome the challenges of the pandemic. In the following pages, you will find examples of our growth journey and how we have had to pivot strategies and reset specific priorities to deal with the dynamic environment.

As the situation returned to normalcy – our students and communities were raring to go, and we at Yuva are not one to be left behind. We embarked on a new action plan of adding the 'Green' component to our School Transformation programme. As a part of this, along with sanitation and smart classroom upgrades, we also work on making school campuses environment-friendly through rainwater harvesting & water recharge infrastructure, solar panels and tree plantation across the school premises. The impact of this will be seen shortly with improvement in the groundwater level & access to usable water in the school and access to power backup for running the primary school infrastructure.

Realising the importance of sports and access to sports facilities in schools, our partners have also come in to support the building of sports grounds in schools. The open area proves to be an excellent facility for sports activities, assembly and other extracurricular activities essential for the overall development of children.

This programme is designed to allow a student to grow and develop through an economic and social opportunity giving them a chance to realise their true potential. Over the years, our scholarship programme has grown from 20 students in 1 state to over 3000 students across 15 states. The scheme has provided financial aid and supported students through mentorship opportunities and connections with corporates for internships.

As we march into a more hopeful year, I am humbled and grateful for the support and commitment Yuva receives from our Donors, Partners, Board of Trustees and Staff members. This family of Yuva will remain unstoppable until we make our vision a reality with commitment and self-belief.



## ABOUT YUVA UNSTOPPABLE

Yuva Unstoppable is a committed not-for-profit organisation founded in 2005 and registered in India and the United States of America. Since our inception, we have been striving to make a difference in the lives of the young generation. We aim to transform the lives of underprivileged children

and youth by maximising impact in the education sector. Our 'Model of Action' is based on inspiration. We rely on our volunteers' strength and youth's power to create a systematic and organic chain reaction to bring positive societal change. We work with over 100 corporate partners and inspire them to care.

## OUR JOURNEY

The year was 2005. After declining a Wall Street job offer, Amitabh Shah and a group of zealous individuals started Yuva Unstoppable as a youth-led and youth-driven organisation aiming to positively change the lives of children and underprivileged youth.

As Yuva started moving toward its development goals, the then 23-year-old Amitabh strongly believed that education must assume the highest priority in India's development mission. He found there was an alarming shortfall within the system.

The aim was to transform the lives of underprivileged children and youth by maximising impact in the education sector. Since its inception in 2005, Yuva has launched several programmes such as the School Transformation programme (building WASH facilities), the Education Scholarship scheme

## OUR IMPACT

An impact assessment by the London School of Economics found that with an intervention by Yuva, learning outcomes improved across subjects (Maths, Science, English), by quadruple times.

What started as a volunteer-driven movement has today reached close to 6 million individuals through several community-led programmes. Yuva Unstoppable has evolved with a clear theory of change – to transform the lives of less privileged children and youth by maximising impact in the education sector.

(called Udaan), Digital Smart classrooms, Yuva ambassadors, Covid relief initiatives, and several other community-based programmes.

Our model of action is based on inspiration. We inspire children to achieve greatness, pursue happiness and become aware and conscious citizens. We rely on our volunteer's strength and youth's power to create a systematic and organic reaction to inflict positive societal change. Among the various pitfalls that affect humankind, hunger, poverty, gender discrimination, poor health facilities, lack of clean water, sanitation and inequality in terms of quality education are the glaring ones. We have the vision to target these lacunae and smoothen these trenches, thereby ensuring a level ground for the underprivileged. In line with this, we have embedded 12 of 17 UN SDGs in our mission.

We are committed to driving this change by focusing on the fundamentals – upgrading basic infrastructure facilities in schools providing access to modern means of teaching-learning, and creating a more compassionate youth who become ambassadors of social change.

Today Yuva has empowered over 6 million vulnerable beneficiaries directly and indirectly, including 3500 schools with improved sanitation, water, access to technology, scholarships, nutrition, etc., and the journey is unstoppable.

## MISSION

To transform 10,000 schools and positively impact 5 million children by 2027. To provide 10,000 scholarships to underprivileged and deserving students in the next five years.

## PURPOSE

To bring a positive change in the lives of children and vulnerable youth.

## & VISION

To educate and transform the lives of children and youth in India by bridging the digital divide by providing devices and digital classrooms and developing sustainable infrastructure for clean water, sanitation, and hygiene. Inculcate a sense of self-belief, confidence, gratitude, compassion and passion amongst the recipients.



## NEW INITIATIVES

Keeping the Sustainable Development Goals in mind, this year, we initiated using technology to conserve water and encouraged the use of renewable sources of energy. To make the school building green and sustainable, we urged the school administration to employ methods of rainwater harvesting and groundwater recharge, using free-flowing water or rainwater.

Many government schools presently need a reliable water source for drinking and other sanitation purposes. Moreover, a lot of rainwater in the country, one of the most significant sources of freshwater, is wasted. The rainwater harvesting system seeks to prevent this wastage, provide a primary/backup source of water for washing, cleaning, drinking, hygiene, and multiple other purposes, and resolve

the drainage issues in these schools. India is ranked number one for its excessive groundwater usage. To prevent a catastrophic future, we encouraged schools to adopt groundwater recharge techniques to maintain a sufficient water table. To promote a shift to renewable energy sources, we facilitated installing solar panels on rooftops to transmit electricity. Schools, which often suffered from power cuts, could now be independent.

We also conducted HPV (Human papillomavirus) vaccination drive to support and encourage appropriate uptake of the HPV preventative vaccination by eligible school girls from government school girls at Lucknow, UP, with mentorship from Hon. Governor, UP, Anandiben Patel and UP government support.



# SCHOOL TRANSFORMATION

A majority of government schools have dilapidated buildings that receive nominal amounts for maintenance. Basic facilities such as washrooms are unusable with no water connections, safety issues, no separate drinking water/ wash area, and dull ambiance resulting in poor motivation levels for students and teachers. This programme aims to provide and improve sanitation, drinking & hand wash facilities, and other infrastructure improvements essential for the running of a school and to create an atmosphere of cheer and motivation while learning. The programme will also set up fully equipped digital classrooms that can be used to enhance learning across different grades.

Key components of the programme include – Sanitation (separate toilets for boys and girls), Hygiene (separate drinking & dishwasher area), Infrastructure (shade area, color work in school building), Digital Support (smart classrooms, tablets), and Behaviour Change Communication (BCC).

Through this programme, we aim to make schools a better place to learn. This is facilitated by creating a child-friendly learning environment in government or government aided / municipal schools through infrastructure development and/or other infrastructure transformation.

## 1. School Transformation via WASH

Poor sanitation, lack of access to clean drinking water, and inadequate personal hygiene are responsible for 88% of waterborne diseases among children in India. In the year 2012-13, we first conducted a survey in 35 schools and understood that they lacked a number of important facilities that are needed by a child for a proper education.

Of all the problems identified, the following were critical problems such as lack of proper sanitation, facilities, lack of hygiene, access to clean water and absence of a vibrant and motivating campus, were improved in the year 2021-22.



## 2. Google Future Classrooms

In 2018, inspired by the Union Government's Digital India initiative, we added a new dimension to our School Transformation programme. Google Future Classroom is a smart classroom equipped with a Chromebook console, smart board, CPU, and technical kit, that gives students an immersive digital experience. A programme manager appointed by Yuva conducts workshops where they teach students soft skills, technical skills, and basic computer literacy.



### 3. Smart Class

Digital education by increasing learning opportunities helps students acquire skills such as problem solving, familiarity with emerging technologies and self-motivation.

Yuva's smart class programme equips schools with latest technology to conduct lessons on digital platforms, giving students an easy interface to learn crucial concepts. Teachers teach students on grade 6,7, and 8 on smart boards and students learn on tablets.



### 5. Stem Lab

Yuva Unstoppable is developing STEM labs in several cities of India. These labs provide hands-on learning tools to students, enabling critical thinking and problem solving skills in students. STEM labs bring a change in the learning-teaching pedagogy, a salient feature of the NEP.



### 4. New School Building

Yuva constructed three-five new school buildings in states of Gujarat and Karnataka. The buildings included amenities such as WASH facilities, classrooms, sports grounds, gardens, furnishing items like stationery, kitchen utilities, outdoor games, etc. BalA (Building as Learning Aid) tools and much more.



### 6. Sports ground

Through the School Transformation project, we build sports grounds with professional coaches. We also offer educational materials and resources that teach kids the importance of exercise and healthy living. Sports can bring people together, build self-confidence, and promote physical and mental well-being. With the support of our donors and volunteers, we can positively impact the lives of children and young adults.



## 7. Solar panel Installation

Yuva Unstoppable dedicatedly supports schools to adopt renewable energy technologies and operate more sustainably. We work with schools to implement solar panel systems, which can provide a reliable and cost-effective alternate source of electricity while promoting education about renewable energy and sustainability. By investing in solar panels, schools can reduce their energy costs and carbon footprint while also providing valuable learning opportunities for students.

## 8. Water Harvesting Project


One of our key initiatives is the water harvesting project, which aims to provide clean, reliable water to communities. Through the water harvesting project, we work with communities to design and build water harvesting systems that capture and store rainwater for later use. These systems can be installed on rooftops, in open spaces, or other suitable locations, and are designed to be simple, cost-effective, and easy to maintain.

The benefits of water harvesting are numerous. It helps conserve water resources and reduce the need for costly and environmentally damaging water extraction methods. It also helps improve the financial stability of communities by lowering water costs and can help improve public health by providing a clean, reliable water source.

# SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMMES

UDAAN is a holistic scholarship programme by Yuva Unstoppable that supports the higher secondary education of meritorious students from economically challenged families. Through this programme, we envision creating a channel for youth to drive social change and a platform that facilitates them to contribute to the process effortlessly and effectively.

Also, Yuva Unstoppable facilitates regular mentoring and training sessions for the beneficiaries often conducted by the benefactors and various eminent personalities & experts from different industries. This enables the overall growth and development of the students. Regular career counselling is also provided to the students to aid effective and rewarding career choices.

# UDAAN

## EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

UDAAN is a holistic scholarship programme that supports the higher secondary education of meritorious students from economically challenged families. The scholarship programme identifies the most deserving candidates through a well-rounded selection process. We give away scholarships, monitor, evaluate student progress and facilitate capacity building among these students. Scholarships are provided for a period of 6 years to the selected students. The financial support covers school fees, tuition fees, books, stationery, and all other education-related expenses incurred by the student.

The programme envisions creating a channel for youth to drive social change and a platform that facilitates them to contribute to the process effortlessly and effectively. The programme also provides an array of courses and awareness interventions for the students by exposing them to mentorship sessions and guidance counselors. This platform provides a chance for children to interact with eminent personalities from various fields and receive guidance motivation and counseling. This enables the overall growth and development of the students. Through this programme, we envision creating a channel for youth to drive social change and a platform that facilitates them to contribute to the process effortlessly and effectively.



### Mentoring Sessions

Regular meetings are organized for guiding the students and helping them overcome their challenges. The aim of these interactive sessions is to build a dialogue around career and life in general, with the students and their parents and boost their morale. The programme offers a safe space for students to freely discuss their problems and to encourage prompt resolution of the same. Quarterly Analysis and Mentoring sessions are conducted to further enable the all-rounded development of these students.

### Expert Sessions

In these sessions, experts from various fields like engineering, medicine, accounts, etc. are invited to share their subject knowledge and experience with the beneficiaries. The objective is to support the children to get more clarity about their areas of interest and set realistic aspirations. Therefore, it serves as a catalyst for effective decision-making and career choices among students. The students get first-hand experience with the challenges of professional life as well as the secret of excelling in their endeavors.

Expert session was taken for Yuva Unstoppable students along with their parents by Dhamecha Group CEO, Pradeep Dhamecha. He shared valuable life lessons with the students and parents and guided them.



## OTHER PROGRAMMES

### REMOTE LEARNING FOR THE NEXT GENERATION

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted school children directly with Governments announcing immediate school closure. This initiative's main aim is to ensure that children experience uninterrupted education, by providing tablets for students from impoverished backgrounds. The blended learning model is envisaged as the way forward and the need for tab-based support is now pertinent, to ensure uninterrupted education. Yuva Unstoppable provided remote learning devices like Lenovo Tablets and internet connectivity to more than 10,000 municipal school-going kids and our young & talented Scholarship recipients to facilitate uninterrupted learning.



This programme is conducted in partnership with the Yale Centre of Emotional Intelligence focusing on mental health.



# RATION

Yuva Unstoppable provided ration consisting of basic nutritional and immunity booster items benefitting close to 100,000 people from some of the neediest communities like government school-going kids who are no longer getting mid-day meals. Other beneficiaries of the programme were daily wage workers, migrant labourers, sex workers, tribal and displaced populations.



## ASSAM FLOOD RELIEF

Yuva Unstoppable is proud to have helped over 24,000 people affected by the Assam floods. The team hopes to contribute helping them in their time of need.

## HP VAN BORSAD

The role and contribution of YUVA in the 'HP Clap project' is managing whole operations and implementing this concept of digital learning for improvised communities at the defined location. The project's beneficiaries are school-going children, adolescent youth and women from 20 identified communities totalling approximately 7,000 direct beneficiaries per vehicle/year. Onboard the HP van there are 120 HP chromebooks with a preloaded course curriculum and a laptop charging cart to charge laptops during transit from one location to another. We provided the HP computer devices to 120 students/beneficiaries across each site. Students would be provided a study time of 1.5-2.0 hours to study for any of the enrolled courses, which would be pre-installed inside the assigned laptops.



## THE STORY OF CHANGE

### Student Name - Bhavya Mehta (Rajkot)

Bhavya Mehta, a scholarship student, lost his parents during Covid 19 on 23/04/2021 (they expired on the same day). After that, he lost his grandparents at the beginning of this year in a gap of three months.

*"I am 19 years old and studying B.Com. (3rd semester) and my sister is five years old and is studying in Sr KG in Vrajbhoomi Public School - Rajkot. Currently, we are staying in a rented house here in Rajkot, Gujarat, with our maternal grandparents. We are five members in our family now. Right now, apart from my studies, I have started taking personal tuition from August at my home and earning Rs 6000/- per month. But it takes work to meet our financial requirements from these earnings. We had received lots of financial support regarding our educational fees and groceries from Yuva Unstoppable when they came to know about our problems."*

Yuva Unstoppable is helping him with his and his sister's last two years' educational expenses.

**THE MAHARASHTRA PUBLIC TRUSTS ACT**
